This year's Rendle Short Lecture will have a global theme; the speaker is **Vinod Shah**, CEO of the International Medical and Dental Association (ICMDA). We have a new venue this year: Yarnfield Park Training & Conference Centre, Stone, Staffordshire ST15 0NL.

Mark Meynell, Senior Associate Minister (Training) at All Souls, Langham Place, London, is the lead speaker at the 2014 CMF Students' Conference at Swanwick, 7-9 February. Mark, who has published three books, Cross Examined (IVP), The New Testament and Slavery (Latimer Trust) and The Resurrection (10Publishing) will expound themes from Colossians under the theme 'the be all and end all'.

Christians in this young church faced many of the same issues we face today; confidence in who Jesus is the key to their resolution.

Professor **John Wyatt** (author of *Matters of Life and Death*) will give the conference address on understanding medical ethics. His seminar will provide further opportunity for discussion. There will be a fascinating selection of informative seminars relevant to student life and witness.

The Students' Conference and the National Conference are both open to nurses, midwives and students. CMF is keen to support Christians in

nursing and midwifery at all stages in their careers and to get a vision of the wider, national work that God is doing amongst medics and other health professionals.

National Junior Doctors' Conference



A new world is on its way,' Matthew Brailsford reminded Junior Doctors attending their annual conference (25-27 October). 'It is important to hold onto that in a world that

is broken, with its disasters, terrorist attacks, poverty, disease and death.' Matthew, who is vicar from Hull, expounded themes from 1 Peter, a letter written to people whose ancestors had been uprooted, sent into exile and had never returned to their country of origin. So they always sensed being aliens where they lived.

Christians today are sojourners too, he said. We are not immune from the troubles besetting our world, but we are called nevertheless to be a people of hope, pointing to God's future. Nearly 100 Junior Doctors came for the event at the idyllic Hothorpe Hall in Leicestershire (25-27 October). Everyone enjoyed the usual great mix of worship, good food, fun and games, and teaching and seminars. Developing Health Course hits new high



Cardiff explores leadership

For the last three years we have been working with a small but dynamic and growing Christian Union for health professional students at the University of Cardiff, including a good number of nurses and midwives, linked with our Cardiff CNM group. In October the Cardiff CNM Group ran a day on Christian leadership in nursing, looking at different biblical models of leadership and how they relate to leadership in the NHS today. Sue Allen (Emeritus Dean of the School of Healthcare at Northampton University) led the day, and there was input from Gwyn Ratcliffe, a midwifery tutor in South Wales who has also been working in Bangladesh with a new midwifery school.


Christmas appeal


