

Why do we need to have a Sunday for healthcare?

- More people pass through the nation's hospitals each week than through its churches.
- On average the NHS deals with one million patients every 36 hours
- The NHS employs more than **1.5 million people**, making it the fifth biggest employer on Earth.

So, what happens in our hospitals, clinics and GP surgeries every day matters to a *lot* of people.

But why should it matter to us as a church?

- Caring work is very close to God's heart e.g. Matthew 25:37-49
- Jesus always had special concern for the vulnerable and needy, e.g. John 5:1-15
- Many of his followers work within the NHS sharing his love and compassion
- That's as many as 1 in 10 of all NHS staff!

There are tens of thousands of Christians working at every level of the NHS, being salt and light and bearing witness to Jesus Christ

- In addition, there are many who provide voluntary care in the community.
- So here in this church you will almost certainly have current and past NHS staff and carers
- People working in the NHS face many challenges:
 - Increased demand for services
 - Lack of staff
 - Lack of time
 - Bullying in the workplace

It can be a cause of stress and anxiety

Christians working in the NHS face particular challenges.

Any expression of Christian faith can bring difficulties for Christian health professionals

So, what can we do as a church?

- Healthcare Sunday is an opportunity to encourage and pray for all of those involved in healthcare
- The more we invite God to move, the greater the impact!
