ave you ever seen something so wrong that you do not know how to pray? How often do we find ourselves as health professionals faced with injustices of different kinds institutional, familial, economic and even political?

We see abuse, discrimination, individuals and families collapsing because they cannot access the help they need, or because they have consistently made choices that put them on a downward spiral.

We see all this wrong that we cannot resolve by our own efforts, and all we can do is pray. But so often we do not know what to pray. We do not have the words.

Paul understood this burden all too well. In Romans 8:26 he encourages us that 'the Spirit helps us in our weakness. We do not know what we ought to pray for, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us through wordless groans.'

Our hope is that the prayer diary is just the starting point for praying for the needs we see around us as health professionals. But we are only highlighting the needs – it is the Spirit within each of us that helps us to pray, even when we cannot find the words and all that is left to us are the inexpressible, wordless groans of the Holy Spirit within us.

Thank you once again for joining with us in this ministry and fellowship of prayer.

Heart disease is a bigger issue for women than many realise, and women tend to have a poorer survival rate from major heart disease because they and those around them often do not recognise the signs. Pray for a greater awareness of the coronary health needs of women in the wider population and in the health professions.

TUESDAY 10 MARCH

Autoimmune diseases disproportionately affect women, but the reasons are poorly understood. Pray that research and resources are put towards understanding the causes, so that new preventative measures and treatments can be developed to ensure fewer women are affected by these disabling and sometimes life-threatening conditions.

WEDNESDAY 11 MARCH

Breast cancer is the most aggressive form of cancer to affect women worldwide, and especially in developed nations. Pray that raising awareness, screening and research into new treatments can save lives and ensure fewer women face advanced breast cancer each year.

THURSDAY 12 MARCH

Access to good **pre and antenatal care** saves the lives of hundreds of thousands of women each year. But in many nations, services are poor, and access limited despite recent advances. Pray that around the world, governments and health professionals would take seriously the need to provide access to the best possible care to support pregnant women, new mothers and their children.

FRIDAY 13 MARCH

Ovarian and cervical cancer are major killers of women throughout the world, especially in the West. Pray that there is greater awareness of these and other cancers that primarily or exclusively affect women, and that more priority is given to research, screening, awareness and treatment.

SATURDAY 14 MARCH

The mental health needs of women are often trivialised, neglected or misunderstood. Social and cultural attitudes, neglected physical health needs and the impact of major life changes such as childbirth and the menopause, mean that women can face very specific pressures on their mental health. Pray professions and authorities across the world would take these pressures seriously and extend the help and support women need.




