

SPEAKERS

Richard Coekin is the Director of Co-Mission and Senior Pastor of Dundonald Church. He is married to Sian, a GP, and they have five children (one of whom is a junior doctor). Richard has been involved in launching numerous churches and other ministries, such as the London Mens' and Womens' Conventions, the 9:38 Apprenticeship Scheme and A Passion for Life mission. He is also involved in a Bible ministry in Westminster.
