New developments in Global Mental Health and their practical application

Tuesday 28 September 12-2pm

Dr Julian Eaton - *Assistant Professor, Centre for Global Mental Health, London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine*

In this module, we will explore the emergence of the modern field of Global Mental Health, and explore its implications for addressing increasingly well-recognised mental health needs, especially in low and middle income countries. We will examine how we might practically apply emerging evidence in practical local services and community development, and what the new paradigm in rights based approaches to inclusion of people with mental health problems in communities means for health services, and organisations working in other sectors. We will particularly look at the role of faith based organisations in promoting mental health and wellbeing, given the important connections that many cultures make between mental health and spirituality.

Healthcare without hurting

Greg Seager is the author of *When Healthcare Hurts: An Evidence Based Guide for Best Practices in Global Health Initiatives*. *When Healthcare Hurts* is the first book to look seriously at the challenges of patient safety and developmental safety in global health missions, and it defines evidence-based guidelines through which these issues can be addressed. Greg holds a master's in nursing/ healthcare leadership and management from The George Washington University School of Medicine and Health Sciences. Greg is also the Founder and Chief Executive Officer for the Christian Health Service Corps (CHSC), an interdenominational mission healthcare organization. Prior to founding Christian Health Service Corps Greg and his wife Candi designed, monitored and implemented global health initiatives in multiple regions; first for a Miami based mission organization and then for Mercy Ships International.

These modular sessions will take place monthly on a **Tuesday 12-2pm UK time**. We encourage participation as part of this learning community throughout the year. However, the course is also open to people to join on a sessional basis.

AIMS OF THE DEVELOPING HEALTH COURSE

1. To provide an interactive but virtual environment to promote learning regarding global health challenges
2. To provide a context, where along with other Christians, you can learn from experienced tutors in their specialist subjects
3. To consider how faith impacts on our clinical work in resource limited settings
4. To develop supportive relationships which can continue through the academic year and beyond
